FOUR-POWER PEACE PACT SIGNED

TWENTY-SIX KILLED, 200 HURT IN DIXIE TORNADO

Property Damage Heavy When Raging Storm Sweeps Over Charleston, S. C.

CHARLESTON (S. C.) Sept. 10. (AP)—A raging tornado ripped through Dixie Charleston early today, killing at least twenty-six persons, including between 250 and 300, and leaving hundreds of thousands of dollars worth of property.

Waves after the destructive twister struck, wrenched down the roofs of several buildings, and it is feared additional deaths will be caused.

Wounded persons were taken to the hospital and the city health department is making arrangements to care for the injured.

Police are making a search for the cause of the storm, which is believed to have been caused by a low pressure and storm system which was moving from the west.

Bowron Aims Ax at Air Corps

ST. LOUIS, Sept. 10. (AP)—A major reorganization of the Civil Service Commission has been announced by the new director, James H. Bowron, who is expected to take office on September 15.

Bowron's plan is to reorganize the commission into three main divisions: one for the general administration, one for the personnel management, and one for the financial management.

The plan is to eliminate the vice squad, which has been a source of controversy, and to reorganize the civil service into a more efficient system.

Sudetenland Given to Hitler

Compromise Plan Adopted at Munich
 Calls for Nazi Troops to Begin Occupying Czech Territory Tomorrow

MUNICH, Sept. 30. (AP)—British, French, German and Italian negotiators today signed a compromise agreement for surrender of Czechoslovakia's strife-torn Sudetenland to Germany without war.

The agreement was signed at the Munich Conference, and it was the first time that the Sudetenland had been given to Hitler.

The agreement calls for the German army to begin occupying the Sudetenland tomorrow.

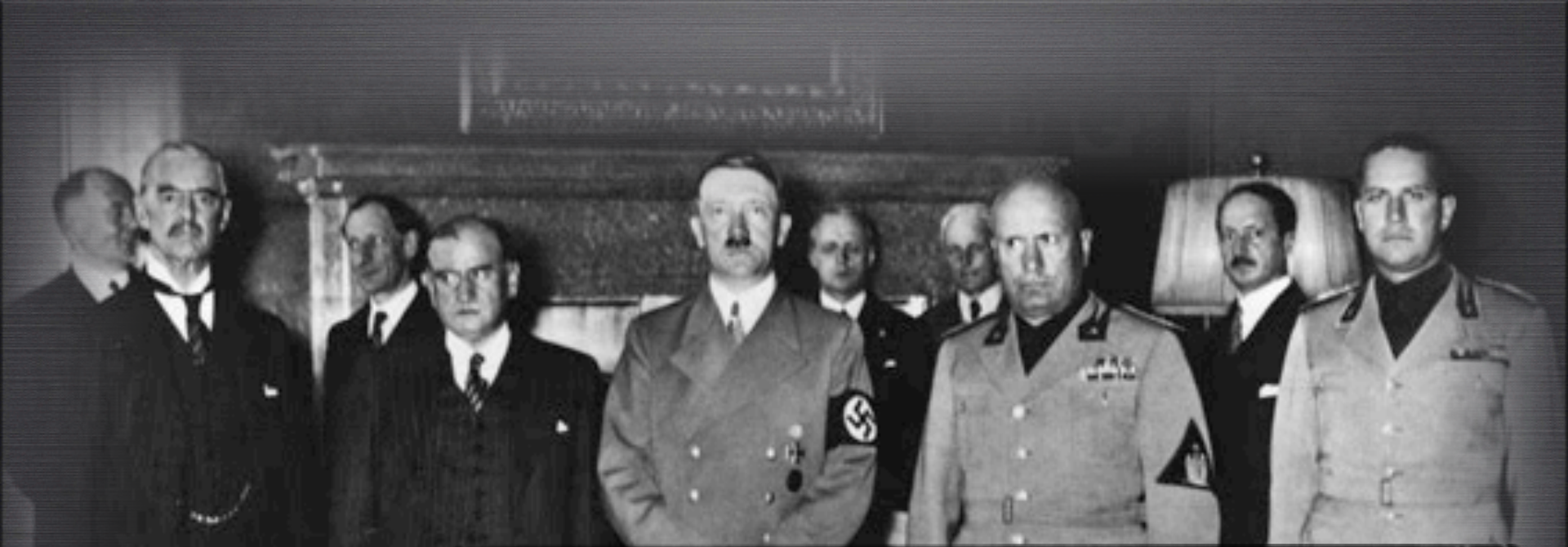


9/30/1938 - Munich Agreement is signed, Hitler gets Sudetenland

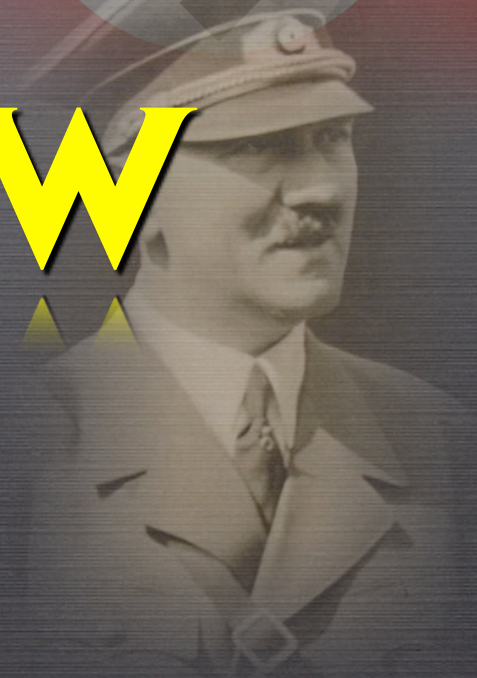
3/15/1939 - Hitler takes the rest of Czechoslovakia

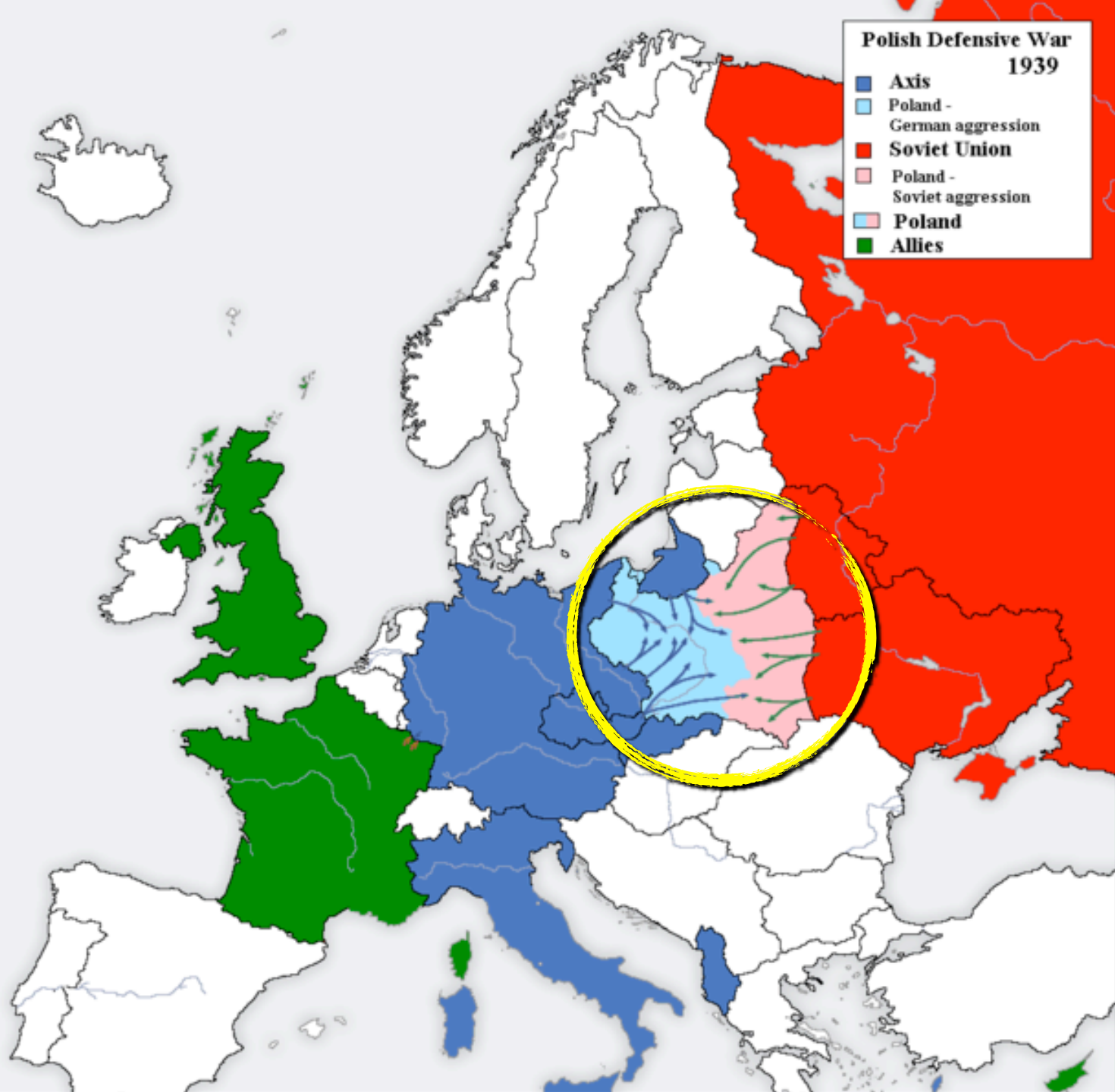
